AGENDA ITEM: Approval of Contract with Midwest Medical Transport Company to provide EMT/Ambulance Coverage for Non-Varsity High School Football Games and Middle School Football Games during the 2008 Season.

MEETING DATE: Monday, February 4, 2008

DEPARTMENT: Athletics and Activities

TITLE AND BRIEF DESCRIPTION:

Approval of contract with Midwest Medical Transport Company to provide EMT/Ambulance coverage at non-varsity high school football games as well as middle school football games. As budget permits and need arises, coverage could be expanded to varsity football games.

ACTION DESIRED: Approval X

BACKGROUND: The Omaha Fire Department provides EMT/Ambulance coverage at varsity football games throughout the metropolitan area, including football games at Buell Stadium at no charge to the district or the high schools. However, the fire department does not have the manpower to provide this coverage for any other level of tackle football sponsored by our schools. Additionally, when the fire unit receives a call the unit leaves the football game and that game is left with no EMT/Ambulance coverage until or unless that unit is able to return to the game. With the approval of the contract with Midwest Medical Transport Company, all home interscholastic football games in Millard Schools would have an emergency medical technician (EMT) and an ambulance at each home football game.

The initial length of the contract would be two years. At the end of this contract the district could seek requests for proposals from ambulance companies interested in providing this service to the district.

OPTIONS/ALTERNATIVE CONSIDERATIONS: One option would be to not provide this type of coverage for football games other than what the fire department provides for high school varsity football games.

RECOMMENDATIONS: Approval

STRATEGIC PLAN REFERENCE: N/A

IMPLICATIONS OF ADOPTION OR REJECTION: Without the approval of this contract, the only games that have the possibility of emergency transport from a game site are the varsity football games. While we hope that we would never have cause to use the service, it would be nice to know that this coverage is available at all Millard football games. With the contract we should not have to wait for emergency transport to arrive at a football game to take an injured athlete to the hospital.

TIME LINE: Coverage would begin with the 2008 season.

AMBULANCE AND EMT COVERAGE AGREEMENT

This Ambulance/EMT Coverage Agreement ("Agreement") is made and effective this ________, 200_____, by and between Midwest Medical Transport Company, a Nebraska Corporation ("Midwest Medical Transport") and Douglas County School District No. 17, which is also commonly known as the Millard School District ("School").

Now, Therefore, Midwest Medical Transport and School agree as follows:

1. Engagement.

School hereby engages Midwest Medical Transport, and Midwest Medical Transport hereby accepts engagement, to provide to School the following services:

Basic Life Support Ambulance with one (1) Emergency Medical Technicians (EMT) and one (1) Paramedic at each middle school tackle football game and at each junior varsity, reserve, and freshman football game held by School, and at such varsity football games when requested by School.

2. <u>Term</u>.

Midwest Medical Transport shall provide services to School pursuant to this Agreement for a term commencing on August 1, 2008 and ending on July 31, 2010, unless earlier terminated as hereinafter provided.

3. Place of Work.

Midwest Medical Transport shall render services at the school sites specified by School on Exhibit "A" hereto.

4. <u>Time</u>.

Midwest Medical Transport 's work schedule and hours worked under this Agreement on a given day shall be such that all scheduled games shall have services pursuant to this Agreement. If Midwest Medical Transport cannot provide the services specified in Section 1 of this Agreement, Midwest Medical Transport shall notify agents specified by the School. The school agents specified by School are those specified on Exhibit "B" hereto.

5. Payment.

The fees for the services to be paid by School to Midwest Medical Transport are those specified on Exhibit "C" hereto. Midwest Medical Transport shall bear all of Midwest Medical Transport's expenses incurred in the performance of this Agreement.

6. Confidentiality.

During the term of this Agreement, and thereafter in perpetuity, Midwest Medical Transport shall not, without the prior written consent of School, disclose to anyone any Confidential Information. "Confidential' Information" for the purposes of this Agreement shall include School's confidential information such as, but not limited to, student information and employee information. Confidential Information shall not include any information that:

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- A. is disclosed by School without restriction;
- B. becomes publicly available through no act of Midwest Medical Transport;
- C. is rightfully received by Midwest Medical Transport from a third party.

7. Termination.

- A. This Agreement may be terminated by School as follows:
 - i. If Midwest Medical Transport is unable to provide the services as stated in Section 1.
 - ii. Breach or default of any obligation of Midwest Medical Transport pursuant to Section 6 of this Agreement.
 - iii. Breach or default by Midwest Medical Transport of any other material obligation in this Agreement, which breach or default is not cured within five (5) days of written notice from School.
 - iv. If Midwest Medical Transport files protection under the federal bankruptcy laws, or any bankruptcy petition or petition for receivership is commenced by a third party against Midwest Medical Transport, any of the foregoing of which remains undismissed for a period of sixty (60) days.
- B. Midwest Medical Transport may terminate this Agreement as follows:
 - i. Breach or default of any material obligation of School, which breach or default is not cured within five (5) days of written notice from Midwest Medical Transport.
- C. Either School or Midwest Medical Transport may terminate this Agreement upon submitting sixty (60) days written notice of termination to the other.

8. Independent Contractor.

Midwest Medical Transport is and throughout this Agreement shall be an independent contractor and not an employee, partner or agent of School. Midwest Medical Transport shall not be entitled to nor receive any benefit normally provided to School's employees such as, but not limited to, vacation payment, retirement, health care or sick pay. School shall not be responsible for withholding income or other taxes from the payments made to Midwest Medical Transport. Midwest Medical Transport shall be solely responsible for filing all returns and paying any income, social security or other tax levied upon or determined with respect to the payments made to Midwest Medical Transport pursuant to this Agreement.

9. Indemnification and Hold Harmless.

Midwest Medical Transport will indemnify and hold School harmless from and against any and all liabilities, claims and causes of action arising from or relating to the services and the actions of its agents, employees, and independent contractors. In connection therewith, Midwest Medical

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Transport agrees to carry, or cause to be carried (a) policies of general and professional liability insurance in amounts and with companies licensed to do business in the State of Nebraska and deemed necessary by it; (b) policies of medical malpractice insurance covering the EMTs and Paramedics for liability claims arising from their actions with companies licensed to do business in the State of Nebraska and in an amount deemed necessary by it but with a minimum coverage of at least \$2,000,000.00; and (c) workers' compensation insurance as prescribed by state workers' compensation laws.

To the extent of its policies of insurance as provided in this paragraph, School will indemnify and hold Midwest Medical Transport harmless from and against any and all liabilities, claims and causes of action arising from or relating to School's activities and those of its agents and employees. In connection therewith, School agrees to carry, or caused to be carried, appropriate policies of general liability insurance and specific coverages as shall be necessary for sound business practices of School.

10. Controlling Law.

This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Nebraska.

11. Headings.

The headings in this Agreement are inserted for convenience only and shall not be used to define, limit or describe the scope of this Agreement or any of the obligations herein.

12. Final Agreement.

This Agreement constitutes the final understanding and agreement between the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof and supersedes all prior negotiations, understandings and agreements between the parties, whether written or oral. This Agreement may be amended, supplemented or changed only by an agreement in writing signed by both of the parties.

13. Notices:

Any notice required to be given pursuant to this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be hand delivered, mailed by certified mail, return receipt requested or sent by recognized overnight courier service as follows:

If any term of this Agreement is held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unenforceable, then this Agreement, including all of the remaining terms, will remain in full force and effect as if such invalid or unenforceable term had never been included.

EXHIBIT "C"

FEES FOR SERVICES

The fees for the services to be paid by School to Midwest Medical Transport are Sixty dollars (\$60.00) per unit hour. A unit constitutes one (1) basic life support ambulance which is staffed with one (1) Emergency Medical Technician and one (1) Paramedic.

Hours for which fees shall be charged shall only include the time when a unit is on-site at a middle school tackle football game or at a junior varsity, reserve, or freshman football game held by School, or at a varsity football game when requested by School, and the time when a unit is transporting any individual from any such football game to an emergency medical facility or hospital and the time required to be spent by a unit at any such emergency medical facility or hospital in conjunction with such transportation. Hours for which fees shall not be charged include any and all other time expended or incurred by Midwest Medical Transport associated with this Agreement or the services to be provided pursuant to this Agreement, including, but not limited to time for the preparation, keeping, or maintaining of any records, logs, reports, billing statements, or monthly statements, time for travel by a unit to the location of any such football game, and time for travel from any such football game location or from any such emergency medical facility or bospital back to the facilities of Midwest Medical Transport.

On or before August 1, 2008 and August 1, 2009, School shall pay to Midwest Medical Transport an advance payment of Twelve Thousand Eight Hundred Sixty Dollars (\$12,860.00) for the estimated provision of 214.33 unit hours of service for each of the 2008 and 2009 football seasons, which run from August through November. Midwest Medical Transport shall submit written monthly statements to School for each month from August through November, which detail the dates and locations of services and unit hours incurred. After the conclusion of each of the 2008 and 2009 football seasons, the School's \$12,860.00 advance payment shall be reconciled with the actual number of unit hours provided, and if the actual number of unit hours provided is less than the estimated 214.33 unit hours, then Midwest Medical Transport shall, by December 1, reimburse School the fees for the estimated unit hours not provided, and if the actual number of unit hours provided is more than the estimated 214.33 unit hours, then School shall, by December 1, pay Midwest Medical Transport the fees for unit hours provided in excess of the estimated unit hours.



Legislative Issues and Happening

- ASSESSMENT: The hearing for LB 987, the first of two assessment bills pending before the Legislature. Senator Ron Raikes, the primary sponsor of the bill, was the sole proponent testifier. NCSA, NASB, NSEA, and a host of school officials testified in opposition. Fred Meyer represented the State Board of Education and NDE in opposition to the bill. Senator Raikes spoke about the need to fully implement the intent of LB 653 (2007). He also said he wants to see an end to mandatory local-based assessment. In related news the State Board of Education voted unanimously to support LB 1157 during its annual session to review pending legislation.
- Bullying Bill LB 205 was advanced to Select File.
- TEEOSA Changes February 11 is the date for hearings on bills that change TEEOSA. LB 873 (Kopplin) provides for a student growth factor in state aid. LB 879 (Kopplin) provides for construction adjustment in TEEOSA. LB 988 (Raikes) is a comprehensive piece of legislation with many of Raikes ideas from past years including changes to class size, inter-local agreements and assessed valuation. LB 1079 (Raikes) will exclude a portion of legal expenses from TEEOSA.
- Learning Community February 12 is the date for hearings on Learning Community bills. LB 970 (Gay) eliminates taxing authority of learning communities. LB 978 (Gay) changes provisions for school district boundary changes for Class III schools. LB 886 (Gay) changes provisions for student transportation. LB 1005 (Howard) changes provisions for LC diversity plans. LB 1154 (Raikes) add the superintendents to the LCC, School district boundaries could be modified prior to the establishment of the learning community, the common levy would reflect the previous resources for the first three years. The potential uses for the learning community capital levy would be narrowed. Provisions regarding the diversity plan and the educational options would be streamlined. Finally, the qualifications to become a learning community would also be modified. Hearings will conclude on February 26.

National Issues

- A ruling earlier this month by the U.S. Court of Appeals for the 6th Circuit, in Cincinnati, that NCLB is essentially an unfunded federal mandate does not give states or schools the right to disregard the law, Secretary of Education Margaret Spellings said. The National Education Association general counsel has said the ruling means states and district cannot be forced under NCLB to use their own funds to comply with the law's mandates regarding testing and school progress.
- The U.S. Supreme Court is expected to be less active this term in the education realm -- a stark change from the 2006-07 session, in which the High Court issued landmark rulings on race, free speech, teachers unions and special education. Last year's rulings were enough to give school districts lots to think about," said Francisco M. Negrón Jr., the National School Boards Association's general counsel.
- At the beginning of last week Congress failed again in its attempt to override the President's veto of the SCHIP children's insurance program. Final Medicaid regulations will end school reimbursements for administrative and transportation services you provide to Medicaid-eligible

children. However, due to our efforts, Congress also had before it legislation to codify these⁴⁷ reimbursements in law, thereby nullifying the regulations. Unfortunately, that provision was pulled from another bill at the last moment

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Status Report on Early Entrance to Kindergarten

LB122 added provisions in 1998 that allowed local Boards of Education to approve assessment procedures for identifying children turning five between October 16 and February 1 to enter kindergarten early. The bill stipulates that the district must develop specific criteria to identify children for early admission to kindergarten.

On June 7, 1999, the Millard Board of Education approved extending the Procedures for Grade Acceleration to early kindergarten entrance. The procedures that the district follows include:

- 1. A parent/guardian wishing to have their child considered for early entrance must be a resident within the Millard Public Schools boundary.
- 2. The parent/guardian must attend a parent meeting about early entrance testing.
- 3. The assessment date and time will be scheduled at the end of the parent meeting.
- 4. The parent/guardian must bring to the testing center, prior to testing:
 - Consent for Evaluation,
 - Copy of the child's birth certificate,
 - Complete the Social/Emotional Adaptive Skills Inventory during the testing session,
 - An \$85 check to the Millard Public Schools
- 5. Early entrance into kindergarten will be based on meeting or exceeding all assessment cutscores.
- 6. A report will be provided the parent/guardian and a copy placed in the child's school record.
- 7. If the child will be accepted into kindergarten, information will be shared with receiving school personnel.
- 8. If the child meets the criteria for early entrance they must attend full-day.

Assessment Components Include:

- 1. Screening Assessment for Gifted Elementary Students SAGES-2, administered by qualified district personnel (a score at or above the normal range based on 5 years, 7 months, the average age for a beginning kindergartner in Millard)
- 2. Early math (counting, number recognition within the average range)
- 3. Reading (alphabet, letter sounds, phonemic awareness, concepts of print w/ three book levels within the average range)
- 4. The BASC is completed by parents (60% or higher)
- 5. Visual motor screening (within the average range)
- 6. Slosson Test or APPSI-II will be administered if more information is needed (Quotient of 120 or higher)
- 7. Other assessments deemed necessary

Current Status:

1. Each year two testing sessions are held, the first in March/April so a child could attend Kindergarten Round-up if they qualify and the second in August prior to school starting.

- 2. Each year we work with 4 to 5 families who are unwilling to accept the results and want exceptions made to allow their child to be accepted. A great deal of time is spent with these families.
- 3. Each year the majority of children test at their chronological age. Many parents participate in testing in hopes of by-passing a year of day-care. Many will ask if their child is accepted if they can repeat kindergarten the following year to be with their age peers, of which the answer is no.
- 4. About 40% of the students tested each year are families from India or Asia.
- 5. The District Acceleration Procedures allow a child who enters kindergarten with advanced skills a procedure and criteria to be assessed and advanced to first grade if appropriate.
- 6. We test on average 18 to 22 students each year with 1 or 2 children qualifying at a rate of about 8% of those tested.
- 7. Each year we receive more calls and requests from families outside the district than inside the district. We have finally gotten the correct number for OPS parents to call. We do not test children who are not Millard residents.
- 8. Of the 11 districts in the Learning Community, Millard, OPS, Elkhorn, and Ralston are the only districts that offer early entrance to kindergarten testing. The qualifying criteria for the four districts are all different. The fee for testing varies by district, \$0 \$100.
